CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

GENERAL

This Show will be conducted as an Age Championship Show under the rules of the Australian Alpaca Association Ltd., (the Association), as set out in the current Showing Rules Manual of the Association, with amendments up to and including those effective from 1st January 2020.

All amendments, where relevant to this Show, have been incorporated into this Schedule.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - GENERAL (cont'd)

Exhibitors are to note that under special transitional arrangements approved for the Red Hill Show, by the Association in 2017, the nominal **minimum** fleece lengths usually applying to Halter Classes at all standard Age Championship Shows have been amended to those of a short fleece Age Championship Show. This to accommodate the closeness in timing of the Regional alpaca show events at Berwick in late February (*short fleece*) and Red Hill, early in March.

The **amended minimum** fleece lengths for the Show are as follows:

*Huacaya exhibits must carry a **minimum** fleece length of 30mm.*

*Suri exhibits must carry a **minimum** fleece length of 50mm.*

The **recommended maximums** for the Show are to remain as for a standard Age Championship show, noting that the **maximum fleece ages** which applied from 1st January 2019 have been retained for the period commencing 1st January 2020.

Details as follows:

Huacaya exhibits: Not more than 14 months maximum

Suri exhibits :

- In 1st Fleece: Not more than 18 months maximum

- In 2nd & subsequent Fleece: Not more than 14 months maximum

The Show will incorporate a Best of Colour competition for Halter Classes, both Suri and Huacaya, the judging of which will follow the declaration of the Supreme Champion in each of the respective competitions.

All exhibitors must be financial members of the Association.

All alpacas (including wethers) must be registered on the International Alpaca Registry (IAR) and be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.

All handlers showing animals must be competent in the handling of their exhibit, or removal from the show ring may be requested by the Judge.

ENTRY & HERD HEALTH DECLARATION FORMS - All exhibitors should note the Declaration on the eAlpaca entry form, and ensure that they can comply with all the conditions, particularly noting those dealing with animal health.

PERIOD OF EXHIBITION - Alpacas must be penned by 8.00 am on Judging Day, in readiness for steward inspection and subsequent judging and may not be removed from the grounds until notified by the Chief Steward.

All exhibitors must place their alpacas in the pens allocated by the Show Stewards and ensure that they are not repositioned or removed, except by order or permission of the Chief Steward.

Alpacas not in their allotted pens and available for inspection at the official time as noted above, may be disqualified by the Chief Steward. Judging is scheduled to commence at **9.30am**.

PREPARATION OF EXHIBITS & CLEANLINESS OF STALLS - Exhibitors must keep the stalls allocated to their alpacas clean and give proper attention to their stock throughout the show. Exhibitors must provide stockfeed for their alpacas, and appropriate feed and water containers. At the completion of the show it may be necessary to clean up the exhibit area - more details will follow on show day from the Chief Steward.

ADVERTISING - A4 folders attached to the front of the show pen are permitted for promotional purposes, otherwise no advertising, sales material, or notices (except with the permission of the Chief Steward) are permitted on or in any pens, stalls or buildings. Display and/or promotional alpacas and for sale signs are not permitted. Stud names are permitted, but must be contained within the bounds of the show pen and to a height of 1500mm. Display of Show ribbons awarded at a Show held at another venue is prohibited. A handler shall be deemed to be incorrectly attired if his/her clothing, or the animal being led, displays any information capable of being construed as advertising for any stud.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY (cont'd)

COMPANION ANIMALS AND DOGS - Special permission to bring a companion alpaca must be obtained from the Convenor or Chief Steward prior to submission of entry form, otherwise no companion alpacas will be permitted.

It is to be noted that in relation to companion alpacas, which expression is to include cria at foot, an AAA Showing & Judging Rule, effective 1st January 2018, reads as follows: "No animal is permitted to enter the show ring unless it is being judged in a current class".

No dogs are permitted into the precinct or where show alpacas are being penned or shown in the ring. Guide dogs and/or Assistance dogs, including those under instruction, excepted.

INSPECTION OF EXHIBITS - The Convenor, in consultation with the Show Committee of a show conducted under the rules of the Association, shall appoint an inspector, or inspectors, who shall inspect all alpacas for IAR number, gender, fleece length and colour classification.

The inspection of all alpacas will commence at 8.00am on Judging Day.

Exhibitors, or their agent, must be in attendance at the time of inspection and will be required to assist.

Alpacas not in their allotted pens and available for inspection at the official time, may be disqualified by the Chief Steward.

Note: Under New Rules, effective for Show Season 2019 and beyond, all pre-show inspections are to be conducted with the exhibitor (or the nominated representative) standing in the pen while the inspecting steward and scribe remain outside the pen - this to better assist stewards while, at the same time, taking bio-security matters into account.

Exhibitors, prior to entering a show, should be aware of the appropriate conformation requirements of their alpacas, as outlined in the current Showing Rules Manual <https://alpaca.asn.au/wp-content/uploads/2019/09/breed-standards-document-.pdf>.

Judges will be discreet should they find a disqualifying fault in an animal in the show ring and will quietly inform the exhibitor of why their alpaca will not be ribboned.

All alpacas must be registered with the Association, and carry an approved brass ear tag showing the alpaca's IAR number. The only person or stud eligible to exhibit an animal is the owner listed on the register of the Association, or the agent of the registered owner.

Note: If there is no IAR tag present in the ear of an alpaca exhibit, official Association confirmation must be provided by the owner to the Chief Steward that the ear tag has been recently lost and that a new tag has been ordered and paid for. Failure to present such advice at inspection will result in disqualification of the alpaca.

No male alpaca shall be eligible for exhibition if it is not entire (except for wethers). All genitalia shall be complete, properly formed and proportioned for normal reproduction.

The Inspector or Chief Steward will classify all entries for colour and has the power to transfer an exhibit to the class in which, in his/her opinion, it should have been entered. The Chief Steward will combine or split classes as he/she sees fit.

Any alpaca found to have lice/mite infestation or for any other reason requires isolation on bio-security grounds, must be removed from the venue IMMEDIATELY along with any other alpacas present that belong to the same exhibitor.

EXHIBIT NUMBERS - Exhibitors shall, on the day of the Show, obtain their exhibit numbers from the Registration Desk in the Alpaca pavilion. Exhibit numbers are not to be displayed on the animals but must be worn by the handler whilst in the show ring. It is recommended that exhibit numbers be displayed in armbands (worn on left arm). The ages (in whole months) of the exhibiting alpaca and of the fleece on that alpaca, must each be displayed on the exhibit number card.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY (cont'd)

WETHERS - It is a requirement for wethers to be registered on the IAR to compete at Association run shows. No wether may have any visible genetic faults or visible physical disfigurement. All wethers must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor, who must also be a financial member of the Association.

Wethers are not eligible to compete for a Supreme Championship - Suri or Huacaya.

EXHIBITORS' MEETING - Prior to the commencement of judging of the halter classes, all exhibitors are asked to attend a meeting in the show ring. to be briefed by the Chief Steward on Show procedures. All exhibitors are bound by the Exhibitors' Code of Conduct.

DRESS CODE - Under New Rules which came into effect for Show Season 2019 and beyond, show ring uniform is to include the AAA logo on either the AAA black shirt or the AAA black vest. The vest may be worn over the AAA shirt or a black shirt (with either long or short sleeves). These are worn over black trousers or a long black skirt and clean brown or black closed in shoes.

Exhibitors are encouraged to make every effort to meet all aspects of the above dress code.

To assist the transition from the previously worn white coats, the Red Hill Show in 2020 will not insist on the requirement for AAA logo-ed apparel and as an alternative will permit the wearing of a plain black polo shirt or plain black long-sleeved shirt with collar, over long black trousers or long black skirt and clean, closed-toed black or brown dress shoes or boots.

Note: *Shorts, open shoes or hats are not permitted in the show ring.*

The Chief Steward may disqualify an exhibitor for incorrect attire. Clothing, displaying information capable of being construed as advertising of any person or stud, is not permitted.

JUDGING - A competitor may not discuss their alpacas, or proposed exhibits with the Judge prior to, or during the show judging. The Judge's decision shall be final. The Judge may choose not to award a prize or prizes in a class.

Note: *Under New Rules which came into effect for Show Season 2019 and beyond, Judges have been given the discretion to award a blue ribbon (instead of a second place red ribbon) if they feel the alpaca is deserving of a first in its class. Judges are not committed to awarding a Champion or Supreme if the alpaca is not up to being awarded a Champion or Supreme at their discretion.*

The judging of the Wether Classes, both Suri and Huacaya, will be held following firstly, the declaration of Supreme Champion in the respective categories and then the judging of their Best of Colour competitions.

CHAMPIONSHIP PHOTOS - Exhibitors of Champion and Reserve Champion alpacas are to make their animal available for photographs at the conclusion of championship judging.

EXERCISING OF ALPACAS - All alpacas shall remain in their allotted pens, except as permitted by the Chief Steward.

CORRECT COLOUR CLASSIFICATION - An alpaca is to be shown in the appropriate colour class, when it is predominantly that colour. Any colour variations will be assessed at time of inspection.

Exhibitors shall not have fleece of a different colour to that of the blanket removed from an animal to a level below that of the blanket fleece.

Exhibitors are to note that amendments, effective 1st January 2018, have been made to the AAA Show Rules relevant to grey and fancy alpacas (Rule 57), which rule now refers as follows:

Grey: A grey alpaca may be either rose grey or silver grey in light, medium and dark variants. A grey alpaca is visually "grey" from the exterior (or on opening the fleece). A grey alpaca may or may not have other white markings.

A predominantly grey alpaca is to be shown in a grey class regardless of colour variations. A predominantly grey alpaca may be entered in a fancy class if it is registered with the APP (appaloosa) prefix and displays six or more evenly sized spots throughout the blanket area.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY (cont'd)

- CORRECT COLOUR CLASSIFICATION (cont'd)

Fancy: A fancy alpaca is to be shown in a fancy class if it has an unusual or striking distribution of two or more colours on the saddle, neck and/or legs on or above the knee. This includes pintos and tuxedo fronts where the primary colour is not grey and appaloosas including grey, as defined under Grey above.

Roan: A roan alpaca is one that is brown, black, medium or dark fawn with a significant amount of easily visible white fibres consistently distributed throughout the entire fleece, once the fleece is opened. Any colour inconsistencies will be assessed at the Judge's discretion.

*Note: E-alpaca will automatically allocate animals to the appropriate class, based upon its registered birth date, gender and **colour**.*

BEST SURI / HUACAYA COLOUR CLASSES - To be drawn from the winners of respective age groups/colour classes, both male and female - example: Best White, Best Fawn, Best Brown and so on. To be in addition to the standard age group Championship events and will be judged after the Supreme Championship.

SECTIONS AND CLASS NUMBERS

- With the introduction of eAlpaca, all Sections and Class Numbers have been re-coded to replace the Show Classes section of the AAA Showing Rules Manual.
- Alpacas will be entered in the correct class for their age on Judging Day.
- Classes will be split or joined if numbers warrant.
- No Suri is eligible to compete for Championships in the Huacaya classes.
- No Huacaya is eligible to compete for Championships in the Suri classes.

JUNIOR HANDLER

A Junior Handler event will be run in conjunction with the Alpaca Youth Groups' competition forming part of Stage 1 - the Introductory element. Two classes, based on age of the handler, will be offered at the Show viz., 6 to under 11 years and 11 to under 15 years. Participants may be invited to attend relevant segments of Stages 2 & 3, being the Showmanship and Stockmanship elements of the Youth Groups' competition. All three stages will be judged on Show Day.

SIRES' PROGENY CLASS - There shall be at least two entries in the Sires' Progeny class before the class will take place.

The progeny class is for two progeny by one sire. A Sires' Progeny entry cannot contain a wether, but may be a group of males, females or males and females. Progeny need not be owned or bred by the one exhibitor, but all must be the progeny of the one sire and drawn from the ordinary classes.

All progeny must have been entered as animal exhibits in the same show as that in which they are to be exhibited as Sires' Progeny.

Only one progeny from any one dam may be shown in each sire's progeny group unless the progeny have been born at least eleven months apart. Only one entry fee per group (\$10) is required. In addition to displaying the Progeny Group entrant number, each member of the Progeny Group is to display the exhibit number from the relevant halter class in the same show.

Note: Sires' Progeny Class may be entered on the day of the Show.

EXCESS ENTRIES - In the event of more entries being received than can be accommodated, alpaca entries may be reduced. If necessary the number of alpacas from any one exhibitor may also be reduced to a figure determined by the Show Convenor. The exhibitor will have the right to nominate the alpacas to be withdrawn should this reduction be necessary.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY (cont'd)

PROTESTS - Only an exhibitor may lodge a protest against another exhibitor or a Show Official. The protest shall be lodged in writing together with a deposit of \$50, which shall be refunded if the protest is upheld.

The sole grounds for a protest shall be a breach of the Show Rules.

Protests shall be lodged with the Chief Steward or Show Convenor within one hour of the end of the day's showing (when the last animal leaves the ring).

The Chief Steward or Show Convenor shall set up a Protest Committee prior to the commencement of the Show. The Committee shall comprise the Chief Steward as the Chair and two ordinary members not associated with the alleged incident. If an alleged incident occurred resulting in a protest in a class where the Chief Steward was exhibiting and his or her exhibit may have some bearing on the outcome of the protest then the Chief Steward would stand aside and be replaced by the Show Convenor or another suitable member. A meeting will be convened within 30 minutes of the protest being received.

The Protest Committee shall immediately investigate the protest and if found to be valid, initiate appropriate action.

Complaints against Judges are to be put in writing, within one week of the alleged incident, addressed to the National Secretary, c/- the National Office of the Association, accompanied by a \$50 fee, which will be refunded in the event that the complaint is upheld.

The protests and all matters arising there-from shall be determined conclusively and shall not be the subject of any appeal to any court or any order for review or of a similar nature.

OWNERS' LIABILITY INSURANCE - a Red Hill A & H Society Inc initiative.

Upon receipt of the appropriate Entry Fee, owners or persons responsible for alpacas are indemnified for their legal liability for bodily injury or damage to property of third parties as a result of an occurrence caused by livestock whilst attending and participating in Red Hill Show events.

LIABILITY - Notwithstanding the above referred Owners' Liability Insurance, **all exhibitors are advised to have their own Public Liability Insurance in place and current to a date at least to include Judging Day.**

Entry to and remaining on the Red Hill Showgrounds (the venue) is entirely at the risk of the exhibitor, and, to the maximum permitted by the law, the exhibitor releases the Association (which term includes in this clause the Association's officers, employees, and agents) from all claims and demands of every kind resulting from any accidents, damage or injury, occurring at the venue.

Without limitation, the exhibitor acknowledges:

- a) The Association has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any exhibit.
- b) The Association has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any exhibitor, his or her family, invitees and agents.
- c) The Association has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to a motor vehicle or any of its contents while it is located within the grounds of the venue.
